Thank you to everyone who has participated to date in the Workplace Violence Study. Your responses continue to be extremely helpful.

However, more participation is required to ensure that the results of this research will be representative of counsellors in BC and help to guide future training of counsellors and other mental health professionals regarding workplace violence.

The study is completely anonymous and anyone who is a counsellor may participate. You do not need to have experiences with workplace safety issues to participate in this survey. How to participate:

The information that is gathered will be used to develop a training program for BCACC members, to substantially improve knowledge of safety and security issues. This study is the first Canadian study on this topic. Your information and experiences are important.
